Bonnie Kathleen (Schoppert) Hohman, 79, passed away peacefully after an extended illness at Brookdale Grandon Farms, Mechanicsburg on February 12, 2026. Born to the late John C. and Vivian M. (Anderson) Schoppert, Bonnie grew up in the Lemoyne and Enola area and graduated from East Pennsboro High School in 1965. After graduation, life led her to Japan, where she spent several years living in Tokyo. Upon returning home to Central Pa., Bonnie built a career in the insurance industry, and eventually retired from Dailey Harvey Eye Associates, where she served in medical records.

In addition to her parents, Bonnie was preceded in death by her beloved husband, M. Dennis Hohman who passed in 2019.
