If you knew Charley W. Sawyer, you called him Chatz. He was born into the Sawyer brood on September 21, 1942, right before his father, Charles E. Sawyer went to serve his country in WWII. Chatz stayed with his mother, Mary, and for his first few years, he always carried around a caricature of his father until he returned from war. He became a highly trained elevator technician and was a 35-year member of the International Union of Elevator Constructors.

Additionally, Chatz provided inspiration and coaching of all sports including girls' softball and basketball and was involved with the Boy Scouts as an Assistant Leader.

He was a member of the Fairview Hunting Club in Ralston, PA, where his buck continues to hold the highest score on the Boone and Crockett scale. He was also a member of the Mt. Zion United Methodist Church, Enola Sportsmen's Association, the Mechanicsburg Club, and alifetime member of the NRA.

He will be forever missed but never forgotten by his “true north” and wife Sheila; his hunting partner and son, Charley M.
