Dolores Murray (Dee) was born in Western Pennsylvania on February 7, 1930 to Lewis and Mae Horne, and was the eldest of five children. After graduating high school she enrolled at Penn State, joined the Chi Omega sorority, was listed in who's who of American colleges and Universities, graduating with honors. This achievement was noticed by the head of advertising at the Patriot News and Dee was recruited and became the first woman in the advertising department. After marrying her college sweetheart, Jack, they both began saving money for a downpayment on a house. Dee won a contest run by the advertising department, selling more ads than her male co-workers, winning the \$5000 prize. This helped them to start construction on their new home. Her children, Michelle and John, were born and besides writing advertising, she went back to college and earned her teaching credits so she would share the same school vacations as her children. She was hired by the West Shore school district, and had a long enjoyable career in education teaching second, third, and fourth grade. Another of Dee's accomplishments was winning the Peterson Award for handwriting. At the request of her principals, she taught other educators how to teach handwriting. Dee attributes her long life to a continuous exercise routine starting from the time her children were small until her death at age 95.

Dolores is survived by their daughter Michelle M. Krieger and son, John A. Murray III, and two grandchildren, Lauren Singiser and John A. Murray IV. She

is also survived by four great-grandchildren, Olivia, Liam, and Logan Singiser, Oliver Murray, and her brother Ronald Horne.
