August 6, 1922 - December 6, 2018

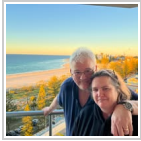

He was a son to the late Ron and Doris (Stora) Gibson. He served in the British Navy in World War 2 . He was a graduate of Coventry College in the UK. He played as a war time guest for the Glasgow Rangers of the Scottish Football League. He came to America after World War II and worked at NBC Studios at Rockerfeller Centre in NYC.

He worked for WBRE in Wilkes Barre Pa where he met Frances Gibson his wife. He was married prior to that to Patricia Ryan a radio actress on the Show “ Let’s Pretend” based out of CBS studios. “ My father served with Bob during the war in the navy. Dad was walking through Stada Cona barracks in Halifax Nova Scotia when he heard a voice calling “Terry... TERRY!”. It turned out that Bob had gone absent without leave to hop off without permission to go and visit Patricia Ryan. Dad was astonished... Dad met him and served with Robert Gibson in Brooklyn Navy Yard. Dad is Terence Rouse now aged 97 and he often laughs recalling the tale of how he had bumped into his friend after Bob had been put in the brig eventually going on to marry his sweetheart at the time. They met when she was a judge in a talent competition and he entered. Dad believes he won the competition. (About 1942.) Such a shame that Patricia Ryan passed away but he obviously went on to live a very happy life in the US with his family. Dad recalls that when they got married there was a front page picture in the British National Newspaper the Daily Mirror (November 27th 1945 he thinks) with the headline “He made her a Gibson Girl.” I hope this is interesting for his family.
