Jack Gilbert Zehring, age 90, of Harrisburg, PA, passed away peacefully into the loving arms of our Lord Jesus on May 2, 2024. Jack was preceded in death by his wife, Dolores Mary. They were married for 68 years. Jack was born June 10, 1933, in Harrisburg and was the son of the late Reno and Mabelle Zehring. Jack lived his life and raised his family in the local area. He was a carpenter by trade and worked most of his career with H.B. Alexander & Sons out of Harrisburg, and also the Quandel Group. He became a Senior Project Manager and ran many projects over the course of his career.

Jack is survived by all four of his children, Jack E. of Mechanicsburg PA, Mark (Carole) of Hernando FL, Lori of Mechanicsburg PA, and Leah (Alex) of Neuchatel Switzerland. He is also survived by 6 grandchildren, Micah, Nathan, Aimee, Elijah and Jack Zehring and Charlotte Mentha, 7 great grandchildren, and 2 great-great grandchildren. He was a wonderful husband, father, and grandfather. Jack was always about family, investing countless hours supporting his family in sports, education, or other activities they chose to pursue.

He graduated from William Penn H.S. in Harrisburg and excelled in his schooling and became President of his graduating class. In football he was a quarterback, in basketball he was a point guard, and in baseball he was a catcher. He met the love of his life, Dolores, while attending William Penn. Of

all the sports he participated in, he liked baseball the most and as a result, he coached many little league and teenager league teams. He was quite successful as a coach and only finished out of first place, one time.

Jack was an avid Philadelphia sports fanatic, especially when it came to the Phillies and Eagles. He remained sharp as a tack through his final days; and could cite every sport statistic and player accomplishment you could ever think of.

He also loved to help others and lent his craft to both his family and friends on any given home improvement or renovation, well into his eighties. Jack was a gift to all who knew him, and he will be sorely missed.
