John Robert "Bob" Hawley, 91, of Lakeland, Florida, formerly of Camp Hill and Harrisburg, Pennsylvania passed away on December 22, 2014 at his Florida home. He was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather. He was born on April 7, 1923 in Richmond, Indiana, the son of the late Herbert and Elizabeth (Huber) Hawley and was preceded in death by his wife of 67 years, Frances C. (Waldron) Hawley, a son, William J. Hawley, and his brothers, James Hawley and Thomas Hawley. He is survived by his sister, Helen Babb (Emerson) of Carmel, Indiana, his brother Josphe Hawley (Patricia) of Denver, Colorado, James wife Sonya of Sarasota, Florida, and five sons, Robert P. Hawley (Jhan), Donald E. Hawley (Patricia), and Edward J. Hawley (Cindy Bennett), all of Harrisburg, Kenneth M. Hawley (Judy) of New Cumberland, and Richard T. Hawley (EvAnn) of Camp Hill;

Bob was a 1941 graduate of William Penn High School in Harrisburg. He served in the United States Navy in the South Pacific during World War II and worked for the Pennsylvania Railroad. After graduation from Dickinson College in 1955, he taught history and coached baseball, basketball, and football at Bishop McDevitt High School. He then went on to a career in social work with Dauphin County and the Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare where he retired in 1986. He was a long time parishioner and youth sports coach at Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament (OLBS) Catholic Church in Harrisburg where his teams won numerous league and diocesan championships. His 1962 and 1965 OLBS basketball teams played in the CYO State Championship tournaments. He coached teams for Midget Baseball of Harrisburg, including a team that competed in the Little League World Series state tournament in 1950. During retirement in Lakeland, Bob was active in the community and a member of St. Anthony's Catholic Church. He established a senior softball league in Polk County, Florida and played in that league for many years. Bob and his wife Fran enjoyed playing tennis and won the gold medal at the Florida State Senior Olympic Games in mixed doubles. They then competed in the national competition at Disney World where they made it to the semi-finals. Bob volunteered as a tennis coach at the Sandpiper Residential Community which named the tennis courts in his honor after many years of service.'
