



LaVern Lamar McDonald

November 27, 1930 - August 11, 2022

LaVern (Mac) McDonald, 91, of Mechanicsburg passed away peacefully on August 11, 2022.

He was born in Lost Creek #2, Schuylkill County, PA, and was the son of the late Edward A. and Emma (Moyer) McDonald. Mac proudly served in Headquarters Company of the 28th Infantry Division from 1948 to 1950, achieving the rank of Sergeant while stationed in Germany during the Korean War. He retired from the New Cumberland Army Depot where he worked for USASAC. He was a 64-year member of Robert Burns Masonic Lodge 464, as well as American Legion Post #26 and Saint Peter Lutheran Church.

He is survived by his wife Nancy (Johnson), daughter Kathleen and husband Dennis Kramer, son Robert McDonald and wife Mindy, granddaughters Megan Kramer and her husband Eric Cosma, Abby Love and her husband Eric, grandson Greyson McDonald and his partner Michelle Beck, great-granddaughters Harper and Hayden Love, great grandson Kade Love and brother John McDonald and his wife Olga.
