Linda Ann (Olejniczak) Myers, died unexpectedly on April 4, 2023. She leaves behind her husband of 53 years, John, and her daughters Mary Lou (Ed) of Pittsburgh, Suzi (Jason) of Carlisle and Jill (Vu) of Mechanicsburg. She was also the loving grandmother of six grandsons: Ben, Eli, Thomas, Evan, Logan and Zach.

Linda, the daughter of Robert and Louise Olejniczak (Oley) was born on March 22, 1948. She was the oldest of four children and is survived by her siblings: Cassa Bennie, Bob Oley and Greg Oley, as well as numerous nieces and nephews. She grew up in New Cumberland, Pennsylvania, and graduated from Trinity High School in 1966. She always loved children and books and attended Millersville University to study elementary education and library science.

Linda and John were married in 1970, and the couple settled in Hampden Township in 1977. Linda enjoyed the opportunity to be a stay-at-home mom and cared for other children part-time in her home. When her youngest daughter started kindergarten, Linda also returned to school. After earning an Associate's Degree at HACC, she followed her passion and became a preschool teacher. She worked for 23 years at the childcare center at the Mechanicsburg Navy Depot before retiring in 2010. Throughout her teaching career, she was part of the lives of many children and their families and was

often recognized in the community by the “kids” who are now adults.

Linda stayed active in retirement, participating in aqua aerobics classes at the West Shore YMCA, and spending time with her children and grandchildren. She and John enjoyed taking day trips to the outlets and the casinos as well as visiting different parts of the country on guided bus trips with other retirees.
