Maryann Allison - Grandon, 65, of Camp Hill, passed away peacefully on the morning of December 19 in the company of her loving husband.

Maryann attended St Theresa's elementary and Cedar Cliff High schools. She served 3 years in the US army reserves. Her radio advertising sales career began in Harrisburg, moved to State College, the Wilkes-Barre Scranton area and finally to Seattle Washington. After returning home from Seattle, she retired from radio and started a new career with the Department of Labor and industry – Office of Vocational rehabilitation from which she retired in 2017.

Gordon and Maryann were married in a private ceremony with friends and family on December 30, of that same year, in Margate City, one of their most favorite vacation spots.
