I met Scott as a delivery person working for NAPA in the early '80s. I had a strong interest in learning body work. He helped me pursue that interest and eventually I convinced him to hire me (to sweep the floors at first). I worked for Scott at Oliver Enterprises body shop in the 80s, and again in the early 90s. He helped me restore my Camaro. And with his help, we restored my 1984 Jetta, and a '82 Rabbit for my wife.

My encounters with Scott thinned over the years. I used to stop by the shop when I had appointments in Lemoyne. But I was never sure if he would be at Herman Ave. or the Red Barron shop. The last time I saw Scott was a year or two ago. I drove by Herman Ave. and found him in the house. We talked a while, and I shook his hand when I left as if he was someone that had a profound effect on my life (he was).

Scott went to Cumberland-Perry Vo-Tech for Electronics Technology in high school. He worked closely with his teacher on the AV (audio/video) van. His teacher went on to work for a local station, which gave us the opportunity to work on some interesting vehicles at the shop. And the Vo-Tech principle had Scott restore his VW Karmann Ghia (which took us a few years to finish).
